### Match Format

- All singles rubbers are best of three sets - the opening two sets have a tiebreak at 6 games all (first to seven points with two point margin).
- If a deciding set is needed it will be played as a championship match tiebreak (first to ten points with two point margin).
- All doubles rubbers are just two sets. So a draw is possible.

The scoring systems is as follows:

- Two rubber points are awarded for each rubber won and one rubber point for each rubber drawn, no points for a rubber loss.
- There are 12 rubber points to play for. The team with the most rubber points wins the match.
- If both teams have 6 rubber points the match is a draw.
- A team will receive 2 league table points for a match win.
- A team will receive 1 league table point for a match draw.
- A team will lose 1 league point for conceding a match.
